## Shake it Off and Step Up!

A parable is told of a farmer who owned an old mule. The mule fell into the farmer's well. The farmer heard the mule braying and went to the site. After assessing the situation the farmer sympathized with the mule but decided that neither the mule nor the well was worth the trouble of saving. Instead he called his neighbors and asked them to bring their shovels and bury the poor mule and put him out of his misery.

The mule seemed hysterical. When the dirt struck his back he shook it off. As the farmer and his friends continued to shovel a thought struck the farmer. After each shovel of dirt was thrown onto the mule he said, "Shake it off and step up." The mule did what he asked, after every shovel of dirt. After a time the old mule stepped triumphantly out of the well. What seemed to bury him actually became his road to freedom.

There is an alternative to every impossible situation. The way is not always visible to us. But our task is not to work miracles, that is up to God. Our responsibility is to prepare the way, committing every ounce of energy we have to the possibility of the transforming power of God, remembering that a single act of kindness can bring hope to generations yet to come. And sometimes, it means shaking off the leaves that fall, the challenges, the dirt of the earth that settles on us, and stepping up.

# F.I.S.H.--Lenten Mission continues

F.I.S.H., Hunt County Shared Ministries, has been designated our Lenten mission. This organization grew from the idea of Presbyterian minister, Bill Hunt, to join with the neighboring Lutheran church to meet the food and clothing needs in Hunt County. Located at 2805 King Street in Greenville, the facility is open Monday through Friday from 9:00 am till noon. Currently it offers a wealth of services but F.I S.H. continues to provide a number of services to address food insecurity.

The MARKS--Meals for At-Risk Kids-- program sends a backpack full of nutritious foods home with qualified kids every weekend to tide them over since they can't have breakfast or lunch at school. People may also "shop" the shelves at the facility. Monday, Wednesday and Friday anyone may drive by and pick up fresh produce and the 3rd Thursday of each month they may pick up a box of food supplied by the North Texas Food Bank. F.I.S.H. also supplies the groceries for Hunt County Shares at Thanksgiving and Christmas. People may also rent a plot in the community garden.

Over the years services have expanded to include payment for doctor's appointments, prescriptions and eye glasses. F.I.S.H. will help individuals to obtain Social Security cards so they can apply for jobs. During the pandemic Hunt County Shared Ministries has expanded its rent and utilities assistance to aid those who have fallen behind as a consequence of Covid. Your Lenten offering will help underwrite the \$100,000.00 spent on this effort and the \$60,000.00 spent each year on the MARKS program. All dollar bills and checks designated for Lent in the memo line will support F.I.S.H. If you give online, just click the Mission of the Month button.

Hunt County Shared Ministry was nicknamed F.I.S.H. in reference to the Biblical story of the loaves and fishes. Wally Jeffers, executive director, has created the acronym **F**aithfully Instilling **S**hared **H**ope. Let's join in this effort by making a generous donation.
