Pastor's Article:

The WORD in the Words

But the reality is that I am always in the middle of a sermon. One is being written, one or two are brewing, and I am getting some feedback on one I just preached. Anyone who says that many words is going to go off the map occasionally.



There are plenty of sources where you can download a tame ready-made "plastic theology" sermon to read to your congregation. Not my style. Preaching the Word is a holy task. It is a struggle in which one is pinned between God's voice and the

voices of the world. And while I am always up for it, I am not ALWAYS up TO it. No one is.

It is understood that God speaks in some way through each of us and so I try to do my share of listening. God may speak through you and I need to hear from you. I welcome your comments and conversations. Reflecting my mediocrity I guess, it often seems that I get very little feedback. Sermons should start fires in the spirit (at least occasionally!) And sermons should call for action (at least *always!*) I am always willing to listen and talk about OUR sermons.

I welcome your constructive and owned input; such dialogue will help us grow and grow together. Let all of our words bring honor to the WORD! (John 1:1)

Church Trustees

Now that the replacement of the Chapel roof is completed Trustees have turned to work in the keyhole. Handicapped parking will be brought up to state standards. The crushed rock area will be replaced with concrete to improve access and provide better control of rain water drainage. The slope on the north side of the Chapel and on the wet side of the West Parking Lot will also be graded to better accommodate drainage. A power surge during a storm three weeks damaged the Sanctuary lighting and the HVAC unit on the northside of the Sanctuary. The lighting and air conditioning systems were repaired including new cooling controls panels as of July 23rd all systems are working. Stay Cool!

We had over 50 families sign up for our 2020 online/at home VBS: Knights of North Castle! We distributed free bags of craft supplies and daily booklets on July 15.




We have also been working on weekly Children's sermons and determining our plans for the fall.
