# CISD Family Services (Stuff the Bus) August Mission of the Month by Judy Rudoff

BREAKING NEWS! School will begin in about two weeks. It's an exciting time for students, but it can be very stressful for parents who must get their children ready for the school year. It is not an inexpensive undertaking, noted Allison Walker. The cost of school supplies alone can run into hundreds of dollars, especially if there is more than one child enrolled. Enter CISD Family Services (Stuff the Bus) administered by Allison Walker and Kathy Myers. It provides school supplies so that kids will be self-confident and have a positive attitude towards school on that first day. FUMC traditionally partners in this effort by dropping dollars and donating school supplies.

Obviously, our donations will not help at the start of school. They will be used to replenish supplies throughout the year.

The agency will stage its annual "Back to School Bash" Thursday, August 4 at the high school from 1 to 6 p.m. Basic school supplies will be available, along with health and dental screenings, a shot clinic, haircuts and much more! All are free for CISD students and families.

CISD Family Services also works quietly throughout the year to meet the needs of CISD students and their families, according to Mrs. Myers. It can supply clean clothes and has assembled washers, dryers and supplies for washing clothes. There are also showers, soap and shampoo for those needing them. The agency also works quickly to mobilize community resources when a family experiences a house fire or other devastating emergencies.
