Steps give us a direction... a way to mark our progress on a journey. Marked steps give us the confidence that someone has been here before. Steps help us make a plan for where we intend to be. Before our dear parents moved to Texas, we had a preferred route of how to get from Dallas to Cathy's home town, Panama, NY. For many years, we traveled first to Texarkana, then Little Rock, Memphis, Nashville, Louisville, Cincinnati, Columbus, Cleveland, Erie, and Home in Panama. Knowing the steps along the way kept us confident we were making progress in the right direction.

Cathy is one of four sisters and three of them live in Texas. On one long trip with several vehicles and before the days of cell phones, we were traveling back to Texas with one of the other sisters in two vehicles. We had traded some kids; we had one of theirs and they had one of ours. So when we got separated somewhere along the way, we knew what we had to do was just drive on back to Texas and trade kids when we got home. Made me a little anxious but we all knew the steps on the path very well and had another family reunical when we got home.

Advent is just such a journey. Steps toward help us mark our progress but the result is worth the effort, and worth the wait. As we take our steps toward Bethlehem and the miraculous birth, let us step and keep stepping closer to Jesus. We step along paths that have been traveled before. We do so in the company of one another and of all the saints of the past. So we are not alone. We step with our own families and church family. We mark the trail with signs of Hope, Love, Joy, and Peace. Then on Christmas Eve, with the Light... of Jesus, the Light of the World.

During the candlelight portion we plan to have a Holy Family for our focus and smiles and, of course, our Silent Night. For many years, this church has been helping to support Proyecto Abrigo on the outskirts of Juárez, Mexico. Several of the congregation have made the 13-hour trip to Juárez to assist in building a home for a needy family. Though it is merely a bare shell of a building, to the recipient family living in a cardboard shack, it is a gift of love that provides shelter, and is for all intents and purposes, a palace for the family.

Your generous donations are needed now more than ever. The mission is now delivering groceries to families who have lost jobs or whose job hours have been drastically cut due to the pandemic and can no longer afford to put food on the table since there is no local food pantry. A gift of \$25 will feed a family for a week, and a gift of \$100 can feed a family for a month.

Operación Abrigo is our December Mission of the Month. Please consider providing what you can to help support this worthy endeavor that has done so much and continues to provide a coat of warmth, a cover of security, a shelter in this pandemic storm. 
