Journey Beyond the Cross

We do a lot of following. We might follow a path, or follow a moonwalk. Follow a character, or a star... or follow a leader. These days, we choose whom we follow on social media. That influence certainly seeks to change our thinking. With maturity comes strength and resolve, but we are vulnerable-especially the young ones. When we are at our best, we carefully examine what or whom we follow!

The sign said... "Choose your rut carefully you will be in it for the next 45 miles"

Imagine, for a moment, an "old-timey" car like a black Model-T Ford... or even a horse-drawn carriage. My father Homer told a story about such old vehicles. Dad said he saw that sign once on a dried-up dirt road that had very deep ruts in it. The ruts had obviously been formed when the road was heavily saturated with rainwater and mud.

"Choose carefully..." Dad would tell that story and expect us to understand what he meant. I didn't get it then. But with some maturity and perspective, I now embrace the meaning.


Habits are important. I form habits and patterns. And eventually, those patterns **form me**. It's easier for musicians to understand that consistent practice makes habits. **We all have to be careful what habits we establish because habits are hard to break!** If I rehearse a musical passage incorrectly again and again, I might never be able to break that pattern. If I learn something well but learn it wrong, well, that is not helpful!

What ruts are you and I in? What is our destination? "Route" and "rut" are close words. What route shall we choose and how do we avoid defaulting to the *well-travelled ruts*?

[Warning: this stream of linguistic thinking is contagious. If you like to play with words as I do, go look up the etymological connections between "root", "route", and "rut"! Some great sermon illustrations and even **prayers** can be formed there!]

You have the wheel. Choose your ruts and patterns and disciplines carefully. You and God are co-creating a journey, a destination, a story.
