Notes from Pastor Cheryl

Let me tell you about Howard. Howard is a resident of a nursing home I visit with others from our church to lead worship once a week. Howard knows every word to every hymn we sing. We rarely "stump" him with one he doesn't know.

He tells the story of when he was a young man and he heard the voice of God – the real

literal voice of God telling him to sing Amazing Grace, all the verses. Now, at that time, Howard did not do much singing, but he was so sure this was the voice of God telling him to sing that he did, he sang Amazing Grace, all the verses, right then and there. And he began to sing in church regularly, and still remembers all the verses to all the hymns.

In this world where our kids have to live with lockdowns and threats of gun violence every day, it's good to know all the words to Amazing Grace. That's why singing is so important in worship, and worship is a defining component to a life of discipleship. If we have committed to be one of Jesus' followers in this life, then it's not enough to sit at home and watch church online (unless there are extenuating circumstances). We are called to gather in person. The word "church" comes from the Greek ekklesia meaning a "called-out assembly."

The Wesley@TAMUC, the campus ministry, is the September Mission of the Month. Like many institutions, Covid dealt a body blow to the student ministry. When Reverend Payton Parker arrived to assume the campus ministry, he found a single intern there. "It felt like planting a new church," noted Reverend Parker, as he set about rebuilding the ministry on campus. The building received a thorough cleaning, a fresh coat of paint, and finally a new name. The Wesleyan Campus Ministry is now known as The Wesley@TAMUC.

With the building in tip-top shape, Reverend Parker has spent the year focusing on spreading the message that The Wesley@TAMUC is open and ready to welcome students back, as well as to reach out to surrounding communities.

Currently, the Wednesday night Bible study has 21 regular participants. Rev. Parker would like to add a dinner, provided by volunteers, before the Bible study, as well as adding additional programs to develop leadership skills. He also wants to promote mission trips, both local and abroad.

FUMC-Commerce has long had a supportive relationship with the campus ministry, and there are several ways our congregation can continue to demonstrate our support.

- 1. We can **pray** for the ministry as it seeks to become an impactful presence on campus and in communities where Reverend Parker is invited to preach.
