



Dear FUMC Friends:

Building a Home This Lenten Season

Over the years, members of our church have traveled to Juárez, Mexico to build cinderblock homes for people whose homes were made of cardboard and other scrap materials. Their effort was in support of the Proyecto Abrigo ministry, which once built over 200 homes per year. Now due to the rampant violence in the area and the resulting cancellation of mission trips from the US, only 1 home has been built in 2011 according to Provecto Abrigo founder, Rev. Jose Luis Portillo, during his recent visit to the Dallas area.

Today is not the time to forget our brothers and sisters in Christ. So far, we built a scaled-down version of a 12' x 24' Proyecto Abrigo home in the Gathering Area to remind us of God's people in Juárez. This year's Lenten drop-a-dollar collection and offerings, which currently totals \$2,323, will be dedicated to Proyecto Abrigo. Members have also brought in a significant amount of aluminum cans, which will be converted to cash as additional support for this important ministry.
