

Dear FUMC Friends:

My grandmother was a gracious East Texas woman. She quilted, gardened, kept a spotless house, grew beautiful flowers, milked cows, and could "wrang" a chicken's neck with her hands, pluck it, dress it, and serve it for dinner.

I have many wonderful memories of her. She could lay a

breakfast, lunch, or dinner table spread that was most impressive. And her coconut cake was an object of reverence: four layers piled high with fluffy white 7minute frosting and coconut. My favorite meal was her fried chicken with mashed potatoes and pan gravy; butter beans, purple-hull peas or green beans from her garden; sliced cucumbers, banana peppers and tomatoes (also from the garden); rolls; and always, always, a jar of preserves. Every meal at her house included a jar of preserves of some kind (peach, preferably).

This used to puzzle me. I'd ask: "Grandma, why do you always put a jar of peach preserves on the table at mealtimes? It doesn't 'go' with anything." And she'd answer: "Because we need a little something sweet to round things out." (Since I married a man with Pennsylvania German roots, I've wondered if Grandma's custom of having preserves on the table is akin to the Pennsylvania custom of having a balance of sweet and sour flavors at every meal.)

For many of us, memories of shared meals are one of the rich blessings of life. We learn who we are at the table: the people we eat with, talk with, and clean up with leave impressions on us that are often too deep for words. It is around the table that we feel acceptance (or not), belonging (or not), and a sense of kinship (or alienation).

I don't think it's just a coincidence that one of the most seminal stories of our faith – Jesus' gathering in the Upper Room with his disciples on the night he was to be arrested – took place around a holiday dinner table. We invoke that night every time we share the Lord's Supper. At Christ's Table, we find acceptance, belonging, and a sense of kinship in God's household. It is as if God offers us a "little something sweet" to carry us on our faith journey. The meals in God's house are always sweet!

As we enter this Welcome Season here at FUMC-C, we mark its beginning on August 22 with celebrative worship, a fellowship meal in which we share our food and conversation, and the re-launch of our third worship service, The Bridge. We hope to have many gathered around our tables who find acceptance and belonging - whether new to our family of faith or well-connected members of many years.

Join us for this Welcome Season of feasting and hospitality!


