Do you need some extra help with food for Christmas? Hunt County Shared Ministries will be accepting applications for Christmas food assistance

Monday, November 26th through Friday, November 30th at Crossroads Mall in Greenville between 9:00 am and noon each weekday, and Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 5:30 until 7:00 pm. <u>Please use the main mall entrance.</u>

And

Monday, December 3rd through Friday, December 7th at 2805 King St. between the hours of 9:00 am and noon each weekday, and Tuesday and Thursday evenings from 5:30 until 7:00 pm.

No late registration forms will be accepted.

Please read the following carefully:

1. Come in person and complete a registration form.

*You will need to show a picture ID, a <u>current</u> lease agreement and a <u>current</u> utility bill that matches the address on the registration form.

- Distribution will take place on the morning of Saturday, December 22nd in Caddo Mills, Commerce and Greenville. You must choose a location for pickup. If you do not choose, one will be chosen for you based on your address. Locations may not be changed once they are chosen.
- There will be no alternative dates or times for pickup, so if you're not available the morning of the 22nd, please do not sign up. If you sign up, but fail to pickup on the 22nd, you will be ineligible for holiday assistance in 2013.

*You may list one other person who lives at your address to pickup your food.

 A confirmation card will be mailed out to each qualifying household with an assigned time and location for pickup. Please keep your card until the day of the event.

> *There will be one confirmation card per address. Duplicate addresses will not be accepted. Please do not attempt to register if someone else at your address has already registered.

 Present your <u>original</u> confirmation card on Saturday, December 22nd at your assigned time and location. Please be on time and be prepared to present a picture ID along with your confirmation card.

Please note: Confirmation cards for qualifying households will be mailed no later than December 13th. If you do not receive a card and would like to check the status of your application, you may call (903)455-0545 December 19-21st between 9:00 am and Noon.

Please do not call before the 19th as we will not have the information available for you.
