
How to help:

Dear FUMC Friends:

This past Sunday morning, I entered the church building around 8:00 am, and was disappointed to see empty hallways and orderly classrooms. The facility felt empty and quiet. Throughout this past week, our congregation was privileged to host a UM Army mission team -- 65 senior high campers from United Methodist churches in College Station and Dallas



and their 14 adult leaders. Our Sunday school classrooms, choir room, and youth room had served as dorm rooms for the campers – some cots were even in the hall-ways! A corner of the Family Ministries Center served as an administrative hub for the group, and the kitchen was loaded with snacks and meal provisions for the week. Having the campers here was like having the kids home from college – a glorious, messy, comfortable jumble of belongings and youthful presence!

The group worked at 18 sites around Commerce during the week, building wheel chair ramps, conducting home repairs, painting, and cleaning up. The climax of the week was Thursday night, when a wonderful meal was served to about 160 people who gathered in the FMC: the campers, those they had served ("clients"), and FUMC folks. After sharing a delicious meal, we moved to the sanctuary to worship together and hear stories of witness from clients and from campers.

The stories were moving and poignant. One woman who is a wheel chair user had not been able to leave her house because she did not have a ramp. Another client has served many in Commerce faithfully over the years, and found herself on the receiving end of service. One thing I found very striking was that the campers chose to eat and worship with those they had served – they were clustered like little family groups in the sanctuary. It was obvious that more had been built than ramps and porches!

On the bulletin board outside the church office, campers and church members were able to keep a running commentary on the week. This posting sums up the week beautifully: "This has been an absolutely amazing church to stay in! Thank you so much for your loving hearts and hospitality (& for putting up with us:) we truly appriciate [sic] it!"

Let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and in action. (I John 3:18)

My friends, love has been alive and in action among us this summer! May God's love continue to pour forth in our actions –
