Dear FUMC Friends:

As have many other Americans, I resolved to increase my activity level in 2011 (aka "exercise" – a word that can make me break out in hives!). Over the years I have been an avid walker – more avid at times, less so at other times depending on what's going on in my life. So I have enjoyed walking around Commerce, learning different areas of town, lining out 20-minute, 30-minute and 45-minute loops around town.



Recently, I wanted to see where a 1-hour walk might take me, so I decided to walk Boisd'Arc Street from end to end. Starting at the south end, I walked in beautiful weather, sun shining, with just enough cool breeze to invigorate me. Such days as this always confirm why I love to walk – I notice things I wouldn't notice driving in my car; the progress on a house getting a new roof, that house getting a new paint job, a car in a driveway being repaired, children playing games, a teenager practicing his skateboard licks.

Meeting the neighborhood animals is always an experience, too. I have made friends with a precious black and white corgi, and have "met" a black, long-haired Chihuahua who takes no notice of me when I approach, but as soon as I pass, I hear him (her?) behind me, vapping me out of the territory. I also see some of you on my walks, and some of you see me hoofing it down the street without me noticing. And I see lots of people I do not know. Some smile and give a nod of the head, and others don't seem to pay much attention. I always wonder what a person's life might be like: are they happy? Fulfilled? Do they have people who love and support them? Do they belong to a faith community? If so, where? If not, why not?

This last musing is what makes me wish I had a brightly-colored tee shirt with FUMC COMMERCE in big letters on the front – or at least a hat! Such things can be conversation starters. Talking to people cold turkey about faith is daunting, even for an extrovert. But a tee shirt can do the attention-grabbing thing for me. There have been times I've been in the grocery store and the checker has discovered I'm the pastor of the Methodist Church. The comments are always positive and go something like this: "Your church does so much good here in Commerce," or, "everyone I meet from your church is so nice."

It becomes plainer to me every day that the witness of this congregation to the community is long-standing and runs deep. But even in a small town, we must keep telling our story about how we experience God acting in and through us day in and day out. People in our

community will not know about the love and compassion FUMC has to offer unless we tell them, one person at a time.
