Proyecto Abrigo in support of its homebuilding, medical and food ministries.

FUMC-Commerce Participates in Proyecto Abrigo Dinner & Silent Auction

Last Saturday night, members from FUMC-Commerce heard Rev. Jose Luis Portillo share his observations on the ministry of Proyecto Abrigo and the circumstances in Juárez, Mexico at a dinner fundraiser held at Suncreek UMC in Allen, TX.

Jose Luis explained how increasingly difficult the situation has become in Juárez. There are daily killings. Juárez ranks as *the* poorest city in Mexico. All mission trips have been cancelled. The violence has led to a mass exodus of businesses and caused an even larger number of people without adequate shelter, medical services, and food necessities. Nonetheless, Jose Luis and his team remain resolute to follow their call to provide a spiritual home in Juárez. People are seeking pastoral care to cope with the turmoil of their home city, and growing numbers of people are coming to church.

In addition to raising awareness of Proyecto Abrigo, the purpose of the dinner was to raise money in order for Jose Luis to continue his ministries. The evening brought in **\$12,985** through dinner ticket sales, monetary gifts, and the silent auction! Commerce auction donors contributed to this success. Is this the fast that I choose, a day to humble oneself? Is it to bow down the head like a reed, and to lie in sackcloth and ashes?

Is that what you call a fast, a day acceptable to the Lord?

Is not this the fast that I choose:

to loose the bonds of injustice,

to undo the cords of the yoke,

to let the oppressed go free.

and to break every yoke?

Is it not to share your bread with the hungry, and bring the homeless poor into your house;

when you see the naked, to cover them, and not to hide yourself from your own kin?

Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your healing shall spring up quickly; your vindicator will go before you, the glory of the Lord shall be your rear guard.

Then you shall call, and the Lord will answer; you shall cry for help, and he will say, "Here I am."

Isaiah 58:5-9

It's JUST LIKE GOD to take something that looks perfectly good and to mess it all up, you know what I mean? So, I pray and fast and read the bible and go to church all to lift me spiritually into God's presence and to receive God's grace in my life. I ask you, what's wrong with that? It's like God just doesn't know when to leave well enough alone. Isn't this the question: "How can I have a personal relationship with God?"

Then why is Isaiah bringing this message from to Israel, to us? I mean, I want to care about people, but this fasting, this religion stuff, it's about me and God, isn't it? Instead, over and over again, God keeps connecting every part of my divine relationship to the people around me.

It's like God keeps saying, "Fasting, are ya'? How about fasting from injustice, fasting from slavery, fasting from oppression, fasting from a world full of hunger, fasting from a community of people with no home and no place to belong?"

The thing is, if I'm honest with myself, I see where this is going. I can try to go without food in the name of love for God while I exclude people from my life. I can try to read my bible and pray for grace while ignoring those who are suffering. I can try to turn my face to God while blindly, callously stepping on my brothers and sisters. But it doesn't work. It will never work.

There is no such thing as a "personal relationship with God" that doesn't include my personal relationship with God's people, God's children.

God, please hear my cry... and when others are crying for help, send me to answer the call, send me to say, "Here I am."
