New Senior Pastor Appointed





Life is a Journey. During this season of Lent, we are traveling with Jesus on this journey of life and on the way to the cross. Jesus calls us to follow him, so of course, we travel with Jesus. What's new about that?!

What I am discovering is that as much as we talk about abiding in Jesus and striving to BE like Jesus, rarely do we intentionally walk in Jesus' shoes. It is much easier to identify with the other characters in the stories of the New Testament. I am like Zacheaus, a sinner



very much in need of Jesus' company; I am like Peter, wanting to follow by denying him anyway; I am like the woman at the well, questioning the provision of living water; I am like the Pharisees, thinking and acting like I have it all together when in truth I have missed the presence of God; I can go on.

This season, we are deliberately identifying with Jesus—his very human moments. In my Lenten devotions book by Henri Nouwen (Show Me the Way), he talks about the very human person of Jesus who is susceptible to human circumstances, emotions and even death. Nouwen reminds us that Jesus is actually the essence of God revealed to us, not a stray moment in time for God—the character of God is revealed in who Jesus is. Jesus' humanity and his love for all and the ways he reaches the unlovable in society are not a blip on the screen of who God is—an outlier to a God whose norm is to be distant and powerful. Rather Jesus is, in fact, the fullest, truest picture of who God is.

All that's to say, that it matters to me that he is human, that he feels and hurts and fears and prays. It shows me who God is. It matters to me that I get in touch with who he is, because I am called to be like him. I am called to be the humble servant and the preserver of justice and the lover of the unlovable. When I do those things, I'm actually more able to abide in him and let him abide in me. I know God more fully.

The end goal is not to dwell in the places of human emotions: temptation, rejection, loneliness, anger & despair. The goal is to know Jesus more fully that we might be more fully known. We strive to live like Jesus in order that we might open ourselves to let him dwell in us, make his home in us as he promises to do. I pray that it might be so!
