Participate in Close the Gap Hunger Relief Campaign benefitting the North Texas Food Bank!


During the month of **May**, every \$1 bill placed in the offering plate will go to help the **North Texas Food Bank** (NTFB) **close the gap** on hunger.

As I write this, I am recalling where I was about this time last weekend (Sunday evening around 8:30 pm). The news had begun to filter out that US Navy SEALS had raided the compound of Al-Qaeda leader Osama bin Laden; the terrorist mastermind was killed in that raid. I was attending a continuing education event with a group of clergywomen from our Annual Conference. As the



evening session wound down, the talk turned toward the news. People popped out their iPhones and laptops, seeking more details of the event. As we chatted, we breathed sighs of relief, and wondered about the extensive planning and training – not to mention courage -- that must have gone into the execution of that mission. The outcome of the raid felt pretty darn good.

But a voice began to whisper in my head – almost imperceptible at first, but growing in its insistence to be heard:

"Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God."

One of the former teaching colleagues of my mother-in-law – a dear family friend -- lost her brother in the World Trade Center attacks. He called his wife that morning of September 11, telling her that he had survived and was okay, that he was heading down the stairwell of one of the towers with a crowd of other survivors as quickly as he could. He promised to call her back when he was on the ground. Shortly after that conversation, his wife turned to the TV screen and watched the tower in which her husband was racing down the stairs crumble to the ground, its outer structure peeling away like a banana skin.

"Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account."

The memorial service for our friend's brother was held months later – there was no body present.

"Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted."

As a citizen of the United States – the country of my birth and a land that I love – and a follower of Jesus' Way, I find myself bouncing between two poles: is my (our) relief wellfounded? Or are we any safer than we were before? For us citizens who are Christian, what does it say about us that we would exult in the death of another human being?

"Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy."

"Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled."

Which comes first – our loyalty? Or our faith?

May God's Spirit of discernment be with us all – Valarie
