

Some years ago, I sat at my table during a break at the yearly meeting of the North Texas Annual Conference and watched as the worship team prepared for the Memorial Service. A large, metal candle stand in the shape of the cross and flame was placed on the altar, alight with flickering votives. An empty vase – ready to receive the white roses that would be placed therein during the



service – was placed nearby. Every year at Annual Conference, the business session halts for about an hour so that conference members – both lay and clergy – can remember and celebrate the lives of clergy and their spouses who have died since the last meeting.

At this particular conference, I was keenly feeling the loss of my own dad, who had died the previous October. As the service began, and we stood to sing the opening hymn, "For All the Saints," I felt a pang of regret and a lot of sorrow. My father had served for many years as a Minister of Music and Education in another denomination. But the denomination in which he served did not hold as part of its worship traditions the holy remembrance of those who have passed on ("too Catholic" was a phrase I heard from time to time in my childhood). As we sang I thought (rightly or wrongly), "No church body has sung this for my dad." And so I sang that day as best I could, mentally adding dad's name to the remembrance list printed in the bulletin.

We are approaching our own All Saints' Day remembrance on November 7. As a worshipping body, we will hear the names of those loved ones who have departed this life, and celebrate their lives through prayer, liturgy, word, and song. To my mind, this is one of the most meaningful, beautiful and poignant days in our church calendar.

So it seems to be somewhat anti-climatic that on that same day, we will gather together to do our annual church business. At 3:00 pm on November 7, we will join with three other United Methodist congregations – Cooper, Charleston, and Wolfe City UMCs – to worship together and celebrate the ministry that has taken place in the last year. We will then divide into our individual congregations to conduct the business portion of Church Conference. All professing members will have voice and vote.

Meetings and business sessions are not often stimulating or inspiring. But our denomination's founder, John Wesley, insisted that "holy conferencing" is a means of grace. By using the term "means of grace", Mr. Wesley maintained that God's Spirit would be present ("where two or more are gathered. . ."), offering grace to each attendee and to the entire gathering. Understood as a means of grace, our conferencing together on November 7 holds within it the potential to be blessing and challenge, call and response.

Just as I experienced the uplifting support of my fellow conference members years ago in the sharing of worship, so may we experience the same support and grace on November 7. I look forward to seeing you there!

## Usher Stew Brought in \$900 to Fight Hunger

FUMC's Usher Stew raised \$900 to support local food assistance programs of the Alliance of Ministry! Everyone enjoyed a great meal while taking a step towards making Commerce a hunger-free community. Members of Alliance churches joined us in fellowship as well, so it was truly a community event. Everyone helped contribute to the cause of ensuring there is food on the table for a neighbor in need.

The Alliance of Ministry will administer the money to organizations serving the food insecure. One such organization is Word of Life Family Church, a member agency of the North Texas Food Bank (NTFB). Just last Wednesday, Word of Life assisted 153 families through its Commerce Food Distribution in addition to the 45 Manna Mover clients who received food box deliveries. Word of Life is able to serve so many through its buying power at the NTFB where \$1 buys 7 pounds of food.

As a reminder, all \$1 bills placed in the offering plate during October will also go to the Alliance of Ministry. A donation in any amount goes a long way to provide food for the hungry in Commerce.



## **Thanksgiving Volunteers Needed**
