Dear FUMC Friends:

Just as we are collectively beginning to breathe a tad easier over the situation in Syria comes more horrible news about deadly shootings at the Navy Yard in our nation's capital. The story in inexplicably sad and wrenching: people just beginning their normal work week have their day in, day out reality abruptly altered. Families receive news that the loved one they sent off to work will not come home.



And the alleged shooter seemingly carried torment and secrets within his being.

As I write this, it's been five days since the shootings. The front page headlines have already changed, moving us on to other stories. We shake our heads, say a prayer for those who have lost a loved one, and move on.

But I'm not convinced that we really move on. Stress and trauma are absorbed into our beings somehow – even if that trauma doesn't affect us directly. It wouldn't surprise me if we learned that our brains somehow register loss and trauma physically, much as a tree exhibits growth rings that show seasons of plenty or drought.

We fool ourselves, thinking we are isolated individuals affected only by who and what immediately surround us. From a faith standpoint, individualism is a heresy – we are all connected into a body that finds its home within the divine Body. Paul's metaphor in his first letter to the church at Corinth insists on this: no part of the Body can exist in isolation. Each part needs all the other parts to function well, and when one part hurts, the entire body hurts.

And so we hurt – for those who have suffered loss, for those who live with inner torment every day of their lives, and for those who are left behind, trying to make sense of such senselessness.

We hurt – and God hurts with us. May our prayers rise and connect us ever more deeply together.

May the peace that passes all understanding be with you – *Valarie*

to refurbish and maintain its house of worship. This October, the congregation will celebrate its 25th birthday.




DID YOU KNOW that 31 members of our congregation who are not able to attend worship regularly receive a weekly newsletter with a devotional and activity
