FINANCE COMMITTEE





FUMC Prayer Shawl Ministry meets in the Prayer Shawl room each month and had to add a table in September for new participants. Members knit, crochet, and quilt items to be given to church members and others who are ill or who have had a death in the family. All church members are welcome to send names of persons in need of a prayer shawl or lap robe or to be added to the list of holiday card recipients. If an item has already been taken, then a card will be sent. Prayer shawl members gathered at MUGS in September to create Thanksgiving cards for home bound members and those in care facilities. Other projects include chemo caps that are distributed at the cancer hospital in Greenville, mufflers and stocking caps for Operation Gratitude, and items to be sold at the Merry Market in December. Proceeds from the market and memorial donations are used for cards, postage and yarn. Prayer shawl meets at 9:30 a.m. on the second Monday of each month. All knitters and/or crocheters are welcome to attend or to donate items. Members will give lessons to new or out of practice crafters. Contacts are Laura Milligan, Janet Latham, or Susan Patton.



October's Mission of the Month is Hunt County Clothe-a-Child (HCCAC), which has been providing clothing to children in need since 1989. All \$1 bills and designated gifts placed in the offering plate during October



will benefit this important program.

Last December, HCCAC was able to provide clothing for 100% of the 304 qualifying Commerce children. Commerce students referred by teachers and counselors are provided with \$50 - \$75 worth of clothing and shoes purchased at our local Wal-Mart. Also throughout the year, Clothe-a-Child provides help to families in distress, due to fire, flood, tornado or other natural disasters.

Wesleyan Campus Ministry Pride Retreat

On the weekend of September 15th and 16th, the Wesleyan Campus Ministry at Texas A&M – Commerce traveled to Oak

Lawn UMC to participate in a mission opportunity and the Dallas Pride Parade. We met up with Synergy Wesley from the University of Texas – Dallas on that Saturday and volunteered our time serving Oak Lawn' clothing ministry by sorting, organizing, cleaning up, and moving clothes, boxes, and other items so



Oak Lawn could better serve the community. Afterwards we all went to a local burger restaurant and enjoyed some personal fellowship as we engaged with each other and got to know one another a bit more. Personally, I met and talked to Kat Singleton from Synergy Wesley where we discussed how both of our campus ministries have given us an inclusive and safe place to grow in our faith. Saturday was ended with a small group discussion over contemplation and better understanding what it means to be made in the image of God. Brian Dierolf, the campus pastor at the TAMUC Wesleyan led the discussion over contemplation, which spoke to me and many of the others. He then served communion to everyone. UTD Wesley's campus minister, Brittany Burrows, led us in worship and in a powerful activity about knowing what it means to be made in the image of God. The small group was extremely meaningful to the retreaters. We have all struggled with feelings of isolation and rejection due to the unfortunate nature of many churches and Christians choosing to hate those with different gender representations and/or sexual orientations instead of loving them. Because of this, the small group was very personal and meaningful to, especially to the new students who had yet to fully experience what love and acceptance by true Christians is like.



On Sunday, we helped Oak Lawn prepare for their 11am service and Pride Parade. Some of us assisted a local activist by helping him install his art piece which centered around bringing awareness to the sexual violence many middle-aged and older LGBTO+ individuals face. Others helped Oak Lawn personnel set up equipment on the front stairs for the morning service. While others assisted Oak Lawn with their ADA accessible seating area which helped disabled persons view the parade from a safe and comfortable space. During the setup we all enjoyed a wonderful service by Oak Lawn where a great message of walking in the life God has called you, regardless of what others say, was preached. Finally, we watched the Dallas Pride Parade and continued to assist as needed. Overall, the entire retreat was a great opportunity to serve mar-

ginalized communities and show the world what true Christian compassion and justice looks like. Not only did the retreat serve the community, it also served everyone who participated in it; we all made new friends and grew closer to preexisting ones, along with deepening our faith and individual walks with God.
