

Dear FUMC Friends:

Several years ago, a woman transferred her membership to the church where I was serving. A few weeks after she joined, she shared with me the crowning reason for her joining: "On my first Sunday, I entered the back of the sanctuary, feeling very unsure of where I should sit. I didn't know anyone, so that compounded my trepidation. An older couple walked in – they appeared to be



in their eighties – and walked to the row where I was sitting. I was afraid I was sitting in their usual spot, and made a move to get up and change seats. The woman stuck out her hand and said, 'I don't believe I know you," and she introduced herself while shaking my hand. She touched me on the shoulder and asked me to remain where I was, then proceeded to introduce me to everyone else seated around. I realized that this is the kind of church I want to be in - one where visitors receive that kind of welcome!"

The welcome this woman received – and all who enter any sanctuary and receive warm welcomes – is a sign of God's generosity toward us. To envelop a guest with hospitality is to extend the same invitation we each have received from Christ. We become a means of connection to God for anyone who enters our doors.

In a very real sense, we are an extension of God's household: God has thrown open the doors and invited all who will come to worship, to study, to serve, to commune. It is an ever-expanding "house." Beginning October 10, we will consider "Who We Are" in light of being members and stewards of God's household. We will sift through what it means to *connect* people to God's table; grow them (and ourselves) as disciples; and in turn, serve our community – both locally and globally.

From whom and from where do we find the energy and resources to do this? I believe we can find encouragement from our brother Paul, the Pharisee-turned-apostle:

"For it is the God who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ. But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us." (II Corinthians 4.6-7, NRSV)

Left to our own devices, we might dissolve into despair, or hubris, or intransigence such are the limitations of shared humanity. But God can use such imperfections; indeed, God always has. God will bless and use these jars of clay that we are, and bring about something altogether new and faithful. After all, if the clay jar weren't cracked, the treasure within would never be revealed.

May our cracked jars of clay show forth God's light all over this community and world –
