### Art for Christ @ a New Day and Time!

I'm excited to announce that Art for Christ will be changing to a Saturday Morning Art Program for this coming Fall Semester!

We will have four class meetings from 9:00-11:00 am during the Fall Session on October 3, October 10, October 17, and October 24. The longer class period will allow for two lessons during the class.

Just as in the past semesters, Art for Christ is open to students in grades 3<sup>rd</sup> though 6<sup>th</sup>. During the Fall Session we will be discussing 2 Dimensional Art, and will be working with both traditional and not so traditional art supplies. We will have time to compare and contrast each others work, as well as discuss how the student's work compares to better known artist's.

A supply fee of \$10 per class will be due at the beginning of each class day, making the Entire Session \$40. If you register and pay for the Entire Session before September 14, 2015, a \$5 discount is given making the total \$35 for the Entire Session. You may wait to register and pay the day of the class, however you will not be guaranteed a spot. Your child's spot is only held after the supply fee has been paid. Please make checks payable to JOANNA THRIFT. Supply Fees and Registrations may be dropped off in the Art for Christ box in the office at First United Methodist Church-Commerce. The Registration forms may also my be emailed to joanna@fumccommerce.org, but remember, your child's spot will only be held after the supply fee has been paid.

There must be at least 10 students registered, and their supply fees paid before September, 14 for the class to make. If the class does not make, all supply fees will be refunded. The class number will not exceed 15 students.

I am looking forward to the exciting things this new class structure will allow us to do.

# East District Churches Take First Step



There were lots of cars in the parking lot at FUMC Commerce on Sunday afternoon, August 2, at 5 p.m. Over 60 people from nine area United Methodist churches gathered to learn about the North Texas Conference's Zip Code Connection, a ministry with the poor to eliminate poverty in the two zip codes identified as being most in need of support.

After an old-fashioned hot dog supper with typical sides and lots of fellowship, Melinda Watters, Connections Director for 75426/Red River County, spoke. On the job for about six months, Melinda talked about her own "back story" explaining why this project captured her imagination, suggested several books that help one understand the impact of poverty on people, and described some of the work that has been ongoing. The idea is to help the community help itself. For instance, instead of churches providing food, assist the community in organizing a food co-op. The program ended with Melinda fielding questions from the inquisitive audience.

East District Superintendent Reverend Vic Casad expressed his gratitude that such a meeting was held, pointing out that the first step necessary was to be informed. Now we <u>United</u> Methodist could be more knowledgeable in lending our support to the initiative and to each other.

Our mission of the month in July was the Zip Code Connection, and \$295 was received through drop-a-dollar giving. The Serve team used Serve funds to increase the donation by \$205, bringing the gift to support 75426 to \$500. To learn more about this ministry, visit www.zipcodeconnection.org.

#### Following Your Mission Giving

Serving up breakfast for church members and neighbors... supporting youth in mission... responding to natural disasters near home and overseas... These are some of the missions your giving and proceeds from the 2014 Merry Marketplace & Lunch have supported thus far in 2015.

Your Serve team is responsible for administering the drop-a-dollar and Lenten offerings and the funds raised for general missions. These gifts are used for designated missions of the month and allow the Serve team to fund mission activities and supplement giving to monthly missions. The Serve fund started 2015 with \$5,589, which includes proceeds from the 2014 Merry Marketplace. \$4,262 has been received and \$7,976 disbursed this year, bringing the balance as of August 21 to \$1,875.
